the TOWN HALL will be open from 8.00 am on Show Day.  
At 10.30 am the rooms will be closed and cleared for judging.  
**No competitors will be allowed in after this time.**

## RULES

- 1 The competitions are open to all .
- 2 The Malmesbury Garden Club Committee, whilst taking every care of exhibits, will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any exhibit or container etc.
- 3 Only one entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class.
- 4 Competitors in the Junior Classes must be under 14 years of age.  
Age will be taken into consideration by the Judges when making awards.
- 5 With the exception of Floral Art Classes 66-74 , Floral Arrangement Class 75, and material used by juniors in their classes, all exhibits of flowers, fruit and vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 6 The merits of flowers, fruit and vegetables will be judged as far as possible, in accordance with the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook (1999 revision).
- 7 In classes 28 and 33 where quantities are not specified, any number can be shown up to the maximum required by Rule 7 ( Constitution of dishes ) in the RHS Handbook. Judging may be favourably influenced by larger numbers up to this maximum.
- 8 Where different plants, fruit or vegetables are judged against each other their relative merit will be based on the points system detailed in the RHS Handbook.
- 9 Only one variety may be shown in each entry unless otherwise stated.
- 10 Exhibits in handicraft, photography and art classes, 96-128, must not have previously won a prize at a Malmesbury Garden Club Show
- 11 Flowers may be displayed in any suitable vase or container unless otherwise specified.
- 12 Points will be awarded to prize-winners, with the exception of 'Novelty Classes', as follows  
1st - 3 points; 2nd - 2 points ; 3rd - 1 point.
- 13 Prize money will be awarded as shown on page 4 of this schedule.
- 14 All cups and trophies are the property of the Malmesbury Garden Club and must be returned to the Show Secretary not later than the 1st of August 2011.
- 15 Cup Winners will receive certificates. Any competitor who wins the same cup three years in succession will be given an award.
- 16 Exhibits must be set up on the correct benches by 10.30 am on Show Day, when the hall will be closed for judging.
- 17 Exhibitors must not remove their exhibits until the show ends at 4.15 pm., when all exhibits must be collected. The Town Hall will be vacated at 5.00 p.m. any exhibits not collected by that time will be disposed of at the discretion of the Show Secretary.

- 45 Three heads pelargoniums - one or more varieties
- 46 Three asters, singles - one or more varieties
- 47 Three asters, doubles - one or more varieties

Title : ***Memory Lane***

A cubicle with a 610 x 610 mm base space is provided, the two rear sides are approx. 570 mm high from the inside of the base, the arrangement must not extend beyond the sizes and must not be taller than top of the sides (570 mm) Drapes may be secured over the top rear of the cubicle.
